





#### **About the Conference**

The 9th PKU Graduate Student Forum on Ageing and Health, co-organised by the Institute of Ageing Studies and the Institute of Population Research at Peking University, took place in early July 2024. Supported by the "Peking University Graduate Education Innovation Program" and the "PKU-UCL Strategic Partnership Fund – Ageing and Wellbeing Research Project," the forum focused on advancing research and dialogue in the field of ageing and health.

The forum provided a platform for young scholars to present their research on topics such as the development of health services for older adults, social security systems, community-based health interventions, ageing-friendly environments, and geron-technology. Scholars from 49 universities worldwide submitted over 60 high-quality papers, with 26 selected for presentation. The event attracted over 200 in-person attendees and nearly 3,000 online participants, fostering a robust exchange of ideas and research findings.

Distinguished speakers offered keynote addresses that set the stage for the presentations and discussions that followed. Participants explored critical issues such as equity in geriatric care, the integration of health technology, and social policies for ageing populations.

The event also featured a collaborative component with the 7th PKU "Beijing-Hongkong-Macau-Taiwan Ageing Summer Camp" on Population Ageing, which enhanced interdisciplinary and international collaboration. Various sessions, such as "Older Adults Care Talks" and "Cross-Strait and Hong Kong-Macao Wellbeing Technology Reports," provided additional platforms for knowledge sharing and networking.

The forum concluded with a recognition of outstanding research contributions. Participants exhibited high enthusiasm in discussing their work, highlighting the innovative approaches and solutions being developed to address the challenges of an ageing society. The 9th PKU Graduate Student Forum on Ageing and Health successfully underscored the importance of interdisciplinary research and international cooperation in advancing the field of ageing and health.

To further summarise this conference, the forum organising committee, based on the willingness of speakers and contributors, compiled 16 abstracts of presentations at the forum and 6 specially selected abstracts to form this abstract collection. The organising committee hopes to spread the academic value of this forum and lay a foundation for future forums.

#### **About the Editors**



**Professor Gong Chen** is a director of the Institute of Ageing Studies and a director of the Institute of Population Research at Peking University, editor in chief of the Journal of Population and Development and deputy editor of the Journal of Disability Research in China.

As the principal investigator, Prof. Chen successfully conducted more than 50 national research projects on population health and ageing, the ageing industry, gerontechnology, and disability prevention supported by the National Natural Science Foundation of China,

National Social Science Fund of China, Ministry of Education of China, Ministry of Science and Technology of China, China National Health and Family Planning Commission, the Ministry of Civil Affairs and other state ministries and commissions in China. Prof. Chen also directed an assessment of the implementation of the Madrid International Plan of Action on Ageing in China in the fifth and tenth years. Prof. Chen was the leader for a national experts group of disability and ageing for the government and has participated in drafting, revising and writing many major national policy documents on population ageing and disability.

In recent years, Prof. Chen has published more than 80 SCI/SSCI papers and more than 60 CSSCI/CSCD articles. He has translated 5 books and published 3 books. He has won more than 20 scientific research awards such as the First Class of Science and Technology Progress Award by the Ministry of Education of China, the special award in a disability survey by the State Council of China.

Prof. Chen served as the director of Voluntary Service and Charity Division of CAGG (China Association of Gerontology and Geriatrics), director of Disability and Statistics of CDRS (China Disability Research Society), Technical Consultant of the National Information and Accessibility Expert Committee of China, an executive member of the council of the China National Industry Association on Ageing and so on.

In 2010, Prof. Chen was elected as a member of the youth committee of Chinese Central Government Departments. In May 2014, Prof Chen was awarded as the National Advanced Individual in Helping People with Disabilities, awarded by Chinese President Xi and Premier Li. In 2015, Prof. Chen reported on a proposal of the disability and social welfare system to the CPPCC Chairman, Mr. Zhengsheng Yu, which was broadcasted on CCTV news.



Dr. Chengmeng Zhang is a doctoral candidate of Demography at PKU, where he is the recipient of the PKU-BHP Weiming-Fellow Scholarship in the field of Carbon and Climate. He was an Academic Visitor at the Oxford Institute of Population Ageing (University of Oxford), from October 2023 to June 2024, and also a Visiting Research Associate Staff at the University Colleage London (UCL), from the May 2024 to June 2024. Chengmeng is actively involved in several academic capacities, as a youth editorial member of the Journal of Intelligent Society (in Chinese), Article Editor (AE) of SAGE Open, and holds membership in

renowned academic organizations such as IEEE. He also serves as research associate at Institute of Ageing Studies, Peking University, coordinator-in-chief of the Ageing and Wellbeing Initiative (ageingandwellbeing.org) with other colleagues. He is also an invited member of several thematic Discussion Groups on the United Nations Volunteers (UNV) Knowledge Portal. He holds multiple patents as a co-author. He has demonstrated his expertise by publishing research in various Chinese and international peer-review academic journals (SCI/SSCI/CSSCI), including contributions to the Lancet Global Health, Aging and Disease, Environmental Politics, Sustainability: Science, Practice and Policy, IJERPH, Journal of Aging and Physical Activity, IEEE Transactions on Technology and Society, and Disability Research (in Chinese). His interests mainly focus on the fields of climate sociology (climate demography), environmental effect on health, aging research in smart societies, and philanthropy. These fields may seem diverse, but in fact the overlapping content is very concentrated.



Ms. Wenyi Gong is a master candidate at the Institute of Population Research, Peking University. Wenyi obtained a bachelor's degree in Management from Peking University. Currently, Wenyi is pursuing a master's degree in Population Economics under the guidance of Supervisor Gong Chen since 2022, focusing on the social participation and health of older adults. She also serves as research associate at Institute of Ageing Studies, Peking University, coordinating and cooperating the Ageing and Wellbeing Initiative (ageingandwellbeing.org) with other colleagues. Since October 2023, Wenyi has been an academic

visitor at the Oxford Institute of Population Ageing. Wenyi's research interests include employment, labor force participation, intergenerational transfer, and the health issues of older people. Wenyi has also conducted research on time banks and education, the transformation of social enterprises in China, and perceptions of ageing.
